Following on the volumes on *John Wesley* edited by Albert C. Outler, and *The Oxford Movement* edited by Eugene R. Fairweather, this volume makes more accessible to the English-speaking world the German theological scene after Schleiermacher. Gottfried Thomasius of Erlangen was a leading Lutheran exponent of kenosis, in many ways anticipating Charles Gore's theology; Isaac Dorner, the historian of Christology, was a mediating thinker; and A. E. Biedermann was a leading 'speculative' theologian.

As companion and colleague of Luther, Melanchthon has a secure place in history. The first edition of his *Loci Communes* appeared in 1521 and was the first ordered presentation of Reformation doctrine: the edition of 1555, which is now first translated into English, reflects the development of his thought during an active career in which he was mainly responsible for the Augsburg Confession, and played a leading part in the organization of Lutheranism.
