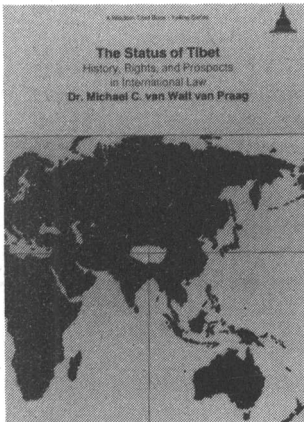

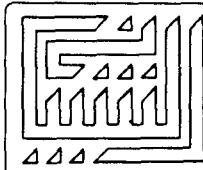

\$500 a year. Any individual or organization eligible for membership may become an Annual Patron for a contribution of at least \$500.

Corporate Members:

\$1,500 a year. Any corporation, partnership, association, or other organization acceptable to the Executive Council is eligible for Corporate Membership.

Life Members:

\$1,000 payment.

Patron:

One-time contribution of \$5,000.
