ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting will be held at the Royal Geographical Society at 1630 on Wednesday 24 October 1979.

COVENANTS

A whole-day meeting sponsored jointly by the Royal Institute of Navigation and the Nautical Institute will be held at the City of London Polytechnic, 100 Minories, at 1000 on Thursday 13 December 1979. The meeting will discuss the use of transponders for navigation, for collision avoidance, and for identification and communication, as well as on the design of transponders, the allocation of frequencies and the use of transponders in aviation. COURSE IN THE SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY OF NAVIGATION

The City of London Polytechnic in conjunction with the Institute each year arranges a course in the Science and Technology of Navigation leading to the award of a Polytechnic Diploma. The course is intended to provide students, who are typically engineers, physicists and others concerned with navigational requirements, with a general understanding of the navigator's problems. Many of the lecturers are drawn from industry and the Services.

The course which is held at the School of Navigation comprises six hours' tuition each Wednesday and lasts for some thirty weeks, starting this year on Wednesday 26 September 1979.
