Doctors and Medicine in Medieval England, 1340-1530

This book is a social, cultural, and intellectual history of medicine and medical practitioners between the Black Death and the foundation of the Royal College of Physicians. The author discusses two principal themes. First is the discrediting of University-trained physicians, followers of traditional Greek humoral theory, during the fourteenth-century epidemics of plague and other new diseases, and the rise of surgeons, who were buoyed by clinical experience and service in royal armies. Second is the role of doctors as an important part of a growing bourgeois middle class. The work draws not only on traditional sources but also on a data base assembled by the author, which contains biographical information on 2,200 doctors.

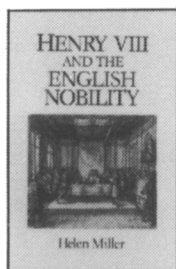

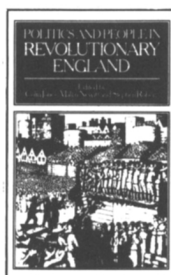
