## ERRATUM

ANIMAL PRODUCTION, Volume 49, Part 2, p. 175, Table 2.

Dr Gibson has informed this journal of an error in the data he presented in this Table. In the first column the costs of production should read 0.66 in all cases. And in the calculation of net maintenance costs per animal, the annual return due to sale of calves (£72.01) was omitted. Inclusion of these returns reduces the net maintenance costs from £452.42 to £380.41. This value should be substituted at the foot of the Table.

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**Abstract.** Every paper should have a short abstract (not more than **250** words for a paper and **120** words for a note) complete in itself and understandable without reference to the paper. *The abstract will be printed at the beginning of the paper.*

**Keywords.** Up to a maximum of five keywords selected from the CAB Thesaurus (1988) or from an equivalent reference volume should be listed at the end of the *Abstract*.

**References.** Only papers closely related to the author's work should be referred to; exhaustive lists should be avoided. The arrangement of references should be as in recent papers in *Animal Production*; details are given in the notes for guidance.

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*Proceedings of the British Society of Animal Production (New Series)* ceased publication in 1975 and the material is now published as a separate section in the June issue of *Animal Production*.

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
