

Editorial note

In common with a number of other areas of academic study, English is, *ipso facto*, the *lingua franca* of popular music studies. As a result, many readers of English remain unaware of interesting, noteworthy writings in other languages. Members of the editorial group of *Popular Music* have long shared concerns about this situation. Accordingly, and as funds permit, we intend to commission and publish first English translations of academic writing which, for members of other language communities, has had some significant impact. The initial such venture appears in this issue, a 1964 essay by Umberto Eco, translated by Franco Fabbri.
