Manuscript submission by disk is not necessary. We require two good quality typescripts and request that authors use endnotes instead of footnotes. Authors should only put their name on a cover page, not as a heading on each page. Manuscripts should conform to the *Chicago Manual of Style*, especially in endnote form. Manuscripts should not exceed 10,000 words and for their return be accompanied by postage.

BOOK REVIEWS evaluate the scholarly quality of books, their contribution to the field, and relevance to other literature. *Albion* does not accept unsolicited book reviews, and does not underwrite the opinions of its reviewers. Persons interested in writing reviews should send a vita to the editor. Proposals for review essays concerning the historiography of a field, era, or important theme in British history are encouraged.
