To commemorate the fifteenth centennial of Islam International Journal of Middle East Studies has devoted two special issues in 1980 to Islamic subjects viewed in the broadest sense. Some of the articles for the two issues were solicited while others were submitted in the usual fashion. The result is an eclectic coverage of a wide variety of topics which range from those with a purely academic focus to others having a broad general sweep.
