91ST APSA Annual Meeting

The American Political Science Association will sponsor a Child Care Service at the 91st Annual Meeting in Chicago. Child care will be available daily in the Chicago Hilton & Towers from Thursday, August 31 to Sunday, September 3. The hours of operation are from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. except on Sunday, September 3 when the hours of operation will be from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

To participate in the child care service, follow these instructions:

1. Complete the child care registration form below and submit it to APSA by July 15, 1995.
2. A \$25 fee is required for each registered child. Payment must be made with the submission of the child care registration form.
3. All registration forms and payments must be received at APSA by July 15, 1995. There will be limited on site registration. On site registration will require a \$40.00 fee per child.

KiddieCorp child care is available for unlimited use to children of registrants at the 1995 Annual Meeting. Parents will be asked to complete a tentative schedule following confirmation of their child care service registration. Nutritious snacks and beverages will be provided. Breakfast, lunch and dinner must be provided by the parents. Diapers, special milk or formula, as well as any written special feeding instructions should be supplied by the parents.

KiddieCorp staffing will be provided according to the following state-regulated staff to child ratios:

- 1:2 ratio for children 6 months to 1 year old
- 1:3 ratio for children 1 to 3 years old
- 1:5 ratio for children over 3 years old

Please Note: Minimum age for the child care service is 6 months.
