BARBARA HEPWORTH RECONSIDERED

Part of the first large-scale critical reappraisal of this artist for more than twenty years, recording a conference held in conjunction with the display 'Barbara Hepworth: A Retrospective' held at the Tate Gallery Liverpool. The main objective of the conference was to bring Hepworth's achievements into revised appreciation, addressing a subject deeply anchored in Modernist interpretation. The result brings together historians who are extending and consolidating conventional interpretation of Hepworth and those proposing alternative critiques. The implications of this convergence extend to the whole field of 'English Modernism'. On the one be as coherent as historians have formerly maintained-that Hepworth may have been fired by quite different intentions and influences than, say, Henry Moore, in spite of ostensible been a pattern of events that evaded critics at the time and which therefore is absent from inherited accounts, and Hepworth may have been much more influential and innovatory than has so far
