When Trinidad was discovered by Columbus in 1498, the island was inhabited by essentially egalitarian tropical rainforest tribes, who lived on the products of shifting cultivation, hunting, fishing and collecting. This book is a detailed study, based on primary archival and archaeological sources, of the cultural changes that occurred in Trinidad under Spanish colonial rule, resulting in the replacement of the indian subsistence economy by commercial agriculture, and the emergence of a multiracial stratified society. Few studies on the impact of Spanish colonialism have looked, as this does, at geographically remote areas of the Empire, or have compared the effects of different institutions, such as the encomienda and the mission, on an indigenous population. Although this study is for practical reasons non-comparative, it is hoped that it will be able to identify cultural patterns and processes that are paralleled in other parts of the Spanish Empire and as such throw light on the culture-contact process in general.

Race and Class in Colonial Oaxaca

John K. Chance. The central concern of this study of changing social stratification in the city of Oaxaca is the development and function of the sistema de castas—the system of ranked ethnic statuses, encoded in Spanish law, that emerged in response to the growth of the New World's racially mixed population. Editorial policy avoids commitment to any political viewpoint or ideology, but welcomes free discussion of such issues in the Latin American context, on the understanding that all responsibility for opinions expressed rests exclusively with the author concerned and not with either the journal or its editors.

Contributions are invited from all parts of the world. Articles should generally not be more than 8,000 words long, and two copies, typed with double-spacing, should be submitted. Diagrams and maps may be included by arrangement with the editors. The journal is published in English, but articles written in other languages may be considered, and arrangements made as required for translation into English. Contributors should keep one copy of the typescript for use in correcting proofs.

Each contributor will receive, free of charge, 25 offprints of their article and a copy of the issue of the journal in which it appears.
