Short Communications & Reports (SCRs): not normally exceeding three pages of the Journal each;

Notes, News & Comments (NNCs): preferably c. half to one page of the Journal each;

Conferences & Meetings (C&Ms): summary reports; important prospects;

Reviews & Notices (R&Ns): of new books etc.

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
