

ARCHAEOLOGICAL COMMISSIONER

CEYLON

A VACANCY exists in the post of Archaeological Commissioner in Ceylon.

Salary: Rs. 12,000 to Rs. 15,000 by annual increments of Rs. 500, with rent allowance according to Government Regulations. The Salary is at present subject to a temporary levy of 10 per cent. The appointment will be on five years' agreement and subject to the rules and regulations now governing the Public Service of Ceylon. Free outward passages to Ceylon provided for the selected candidate and his family (not exceeding five full passages in all). Leave out of the Island is grantable under the present regulations after each four-year period of resident service. The present regulations also provide for the grant of free leave passages to an officer's own country.

Candidates should be University Graduates, preferably with qualifications in Indology, and should possess a thorough practical knowledge of the conservation of ancient monuments and of excavation work. Completed applications should reach the Director of Recruitment not later than the 31st of July 1934.

THE volume includes those parts of the county which have now been absorbed in the County of London, and the pages on these districts include a full treatment of early street-names in such areas as Southwark, Bermondsey, and Rotherhithe. Here and in other parts of the county, the authors of the volume have had to deal with several names of newly developed areas, and the task of tracing the history of such names has not always been an easy one. The work of the editors has been carried out in close co-operation with Mr A. Bonner, who has been collecting Surrey Place-Name material for many years, and throughout the work the editors have had much help from Surrey landowners who have given access to unpublished documents in their possession, and from Surrey topographers and antiquaries who have freely shared with them their knowledge of the county. The volume deals fully with the much discussed *Coldharbour* name and also with the numerous place-names containing the element Friday.
