This is the first book to provide a comprehensive analysis of the action for damages in European Community Law. It addresses the substantial case law built up by the Court of Justice over more than 30 years. The twelve chapters not only give a detailed assessment of the possibility to sue for damages under Article 215 EEC, but also cover the Coal and Steel Treaty and the Euratom Treaty. The topics included range from liability for legislative acts to the practical aspects of causation, from joint liability between the Member States and the Communities to responsibility in international law.

For easy access to the case law, a documentation section has been added in which grounds from the most important judgments of the Court of Justice on damages are cited. The wide-ranging and detailed analysis this book provides will be most valuable to practitioner and academic alike.
