I noticed in your March 1971 issue (Volume II, No. I) in an article by Nicholas Tarling on "Southeast Asia in Australasian Universities" a brief mention of the University of Western Australia. The statement being "that at Western Australia is focused on South Asia" (page 83). This is not entirely true. Our Centre is the Centre for Asian Studies and we are involved in teaching, research and seminars dealing with East, Southeast and South Asia. In our early stages we placed emphasis on South Asia but this was only a beginning. Also the University has a Japanese Studies programme and a Professor of Japanese Studies. Thus we are *not* a South Asian oriented Centre.

I thought I should draw this situation to your attention as we do wish people to know of our true orientation. We are interested in the three regions mentioned above and have courses covering all three areas, as well as holding seminars involving all three regions. Members of the Centre are also active in carrying out research in all three areas at present.

He also stated that 'no Asian languages are taught formally as yet at this university ...' It would still seem to be the case that no Southeast Asian language is taught.
