The Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America invites applicants for the 2003 SHEA Mentor Scholar Fund Award. This award is intended to help support scholarly activity in hospital epidemiology among post-graduate medical or doctoral trainees.

Applications must be received no later than February 28, 2003.

Amount of the Award

The award consists of \$1,000 to be used to support scholarly activity in hospital epidemiology, including purchasing of books, memberships, attendance at meetings, courses, research activities or any combination of these. One award will be granted per year. The successful candidate will be known as the 2003 SHEA Mentor Scholar.

Applicants must be in a post-doctoral training program. Applicants applying for SHEA Trainee Award are not eligible for SHEA Mentor Scholar Award.

Please submit the following:

- 1. A letter describing the applicant's interests in infection control and how this Award will further applicant's career goals. Please limit the letter to one page with one-inch margins and font size of 10 point or greater.
- 2. Applicant's curriculum vitae.
- 3. A letter of support from the applicant's supervisor/mentor, stressing the applicant's potential impact on the field of infection control.

Selection

Applications will be reviewed by members of the SHEA External Affairs Committee. The award will be granted based on merit, need, and demonstrated commitment to healthcare epidemiology.

2003 SHEA/CDC Training Course in Hospital Epidemiology

Program

The program will be held May 3-6, 2003 at the Wyndham Atlanta, Atlanta, GA. Denise Cardo, MD, Loreen A. Herwaldt, MD, Timothy W. Lane, MD, and Gina Pugliese, RN, MS, will co-chair this program. The program, developed by the Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America (SHEA) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), is intended for infectious disease fellows and new hospital epidemiologists. It emphasizes hands-on exercises in which participants work in small groups to detect, investigate, and control epidemiological problems encountered in the hospital setting. These work sessions are supplemented with lectures and seminars covering fundamental aspects of hospital epidemiology and surveillance, epidemic investigation, transmission, and control of nosocomial infections, disinfection and sterilization, employee health, isolation systems, regulatory compliance, and quality

Who Should Attend

You should attend if you are a hospital epidemiologist or an infection control practitioner or if you are looking for a course that will provide you with the most current information concerning infection control practices and epidemiological methods in health care. This fundamental program will provide you with opportunities to find solutions in real situations that will occur in the hospital setting. Intensive problem solving sessions are supplemented with lectures and seminars presented by leading authorities.

Jonathan Freeman Scholarships

Five (5) Jonathan Freeman Scholarships in the amount of \$500 each will be awarded to infectious disease fellows to defray expenses incurred in attending the training program. In addition to the \$500 amount, each scholarship winner will receive complimentary registration in the training course.

interested fellows must submit a letter of no more than one (1) page describing why they would like to have additional training in hospital epidemiology. A letter

from the fellow's program director outlining the applicant's qualifications and suitability for the course also is required. The deadline for receipt of scholarship applications for the course is March 15, 2003. The SHEA Educational Activities Committee will select the scholarship recipients based on review of these letters. Winners will be notified before the end of March.

Attention: Infection Control and Hospital Epidemiology Authors

In 2003, Infection Control and Hospital Epidemiology will be processing manuscript submissions via a new web-based peer review management system called Rapid Review (from Cadmus Professional Communications).

The system will be installed and tested in January 2003, and is expected to go live for author submissions beginning February 2003.

This online system will ensure quicker and easier manuscript submission, will provide immediate acknowledgement of submissions, and will allow authors to log in and check the status of an article as it moves through the system.
