Twenty-five contributions are included, with a world-wide representation of Dr. Hoare's colleagues and friends. Original accounts of work on trypanosomatids include: the cell surface of trypanosomes; a new trypanosome of the cayman in Brazil; routes of infection in Chagas' disease; trypanosomes of a monkey; and interactions between trypanosomes and piroplasms. Reviews are included of the species problem in trypanosomes; terminology of trypanosomatids; intraspecific populations; dyskinetoplasty, nagana in Nigeria; and epizootiology of American surra; amongst others.

Delayed patency and relapses in vivax malaria; a new malaria parasite of a monkey; ecology of toxoplasmids; an annotated catalogue of the adeleid coccidia; a new genus and species of amoebo-flagellates; amoebic dysentery with special reference to the genesis of the disease; and an account of Dr. Hoare's contribution to parasitic protozoology, with complete bibliography, are amongst other contributions.
