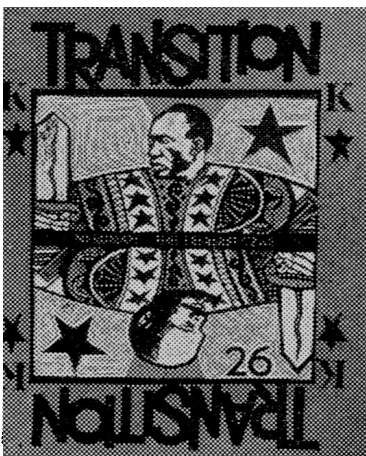

Infancy in Uganda

Infant Care and the Growth of Love

By MARY D. SALTER AINSWORTH

In this field study Professor Ainsworth describes the methods of infant care used by the Ganda during the first fifteen months of a child's life, and considers their effects on his psychosocial development. After introducing us to the Ganda, Dr. Ainsworth analyzes their methods of infant care: their ways of feeding, of ensuring cleanliness and safety, of mothering, training, disciplining, and weaning. The remainder of the study is concerned with the infants' responses to these routines. A discussion of the study's implications for general theories of child development concludes the volume.
