Inquiries Solicited from Faculty and Students
Throughout the World

New York University School of Law announces a new program that will be supported by \$40 million of new funding designed to bring the world's leading law professors and law students to NYU, where they will teach, research, and study side by side with their American counterparts. By exchanging ideas and developing lasting relationships that will transcend national boundaries, these faculty and students will participate in a transformation of American legal education. The program will build on NYU School of Law's existing prominence in international law and legal education and its proximity to the legal, financial and diplomatic centers in New York City.

Two new programs will be inaugurated in the 1995-1996 academic year. The Global Faculty Program will add to the School of Law's faculty up to 20 leading law professors from other countries. The Hauser Global Scholars Program will provide an endowment that will generate up to 20 full scholarships, including room, board, and travel each year for leading graduate law students from other countries.
