Moore, Department of History, Appalachian State University, Boone, NC 28608. All manuscripts, double-spaced and in duplicate, should conform, especially in footnotes, to the Chicago Manual of Style. Manuscripts should not exceed 9,000 words and for their return be accompanied by postage.

BOOK REVIEWS evaluate the scholarship of books and demonstrate their contribution and relevance to other literature. Books in all areas of British, Irish, and imperial history will be considered for review. Albion does not accept unsolicited book reviews and does not underwrite the opinions of its reviewers. Persons interested in writing reviews should send a Curriculum Vita to the editor. Books for review and all related correspondence are to be sent to the editor. Proposals for review essays concerning the historiography of a field, era, or important theme in British history should be communicated to the editor.
