THE SIXTH RSA SUMMER WORKSHOP IN PALEOGRAPHY AND ARCHIVE AND MANUSCRIPT RESEARCH will be held in Florence June 18 to July 27, 1979. It is intended for graduate research students at North American universities. The program includes grants-in-aid which vary according to the student's resources, ranging from tuition for the courses in paleography and manuscript and archival research to tuition plus travel and living expenses. FELLOWSHIPS FOR VENETIAN RESEARCH. The Gladys Krieble Delmas Foundation has announced its 1979–80 program of fellowships for research in Venice, Italy. Areas of study which will be considered include the history of Venice and the former Venetian Empire as well as studies related to the contemporary Venetian environment. Applicants must be United States citizens, have some experience in advanced research and, if graduate students, have completed all doctoral requirements except for the dissertation. Applications will be entertained for grants from \$500 to a maximum of \$10,000 for a full academic year; the deadline is January 15, 1979.
