Doctoral Dissertations on China

A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF STUDIES IN WESTERN LANGUAGES, 1945-1970

Compiled and edited by Leonard H. D. Gordon and Frank J. Shulman

The vast expansion of Chinese studies in the West since 1945 has resulted in an unusually large output of dissertations, of which only a limited number have yet been published in their entirety. This volume, the first bibliography ever to appear in print devoted completely to Western-language doctoral dissertations on China, Mongolia, Tibet, and overseas Chinese communities, lists 2,217 dissertations completed between 1945 and 1970 at a large number of universities in twenty-three countries.

In addition to the author's name, complete title and subtitle of the dissertation, and the university to which it was submitted, the bibliography indicates the pagination of the typescript, the location of relevant abstracts published in *Dissertation Abstracts*, and information on how to obtain copies. The bibliographic listing is supplemented by three indexes: an index by author, an index by institution, and a comprehensive subject index.

This volume is the first of a new series of reference publications, the Reference Series of the Association for Asian Studies, edited by Edgar Wickberg.
