The main purpose of the book is to discuss the probable evolution of European economic and business law. Fundamentally, there is one general assessment regarding future European business law developments: although it is not inevitable and it will not happen without a struggle, it is now conceivable that a single European business law will establish itself.

Among the topics discussed and analyzed in this volume are subsidiarity, ensuring compliance and implementation by member states, common currency, the European Monetary Union and fiscal policy, economic federalism, accounting standards, financial services, corporate law and politics, regulation of takeover bids, investor and enterprise structure, and a structural approach to decentralizing law. One chapter is devoted specifically to issues related to economic harmonization in Eastern Europe.
