Saints of the Missal

By BENEDICT BAUR, O.S.B.

Abbot Benedict Baur's excellent contribution to liturgical and spiritual literature, The Light of the World, has enjoyed great popularity ever since it appeared in a two-volume translation. An equally impressive work of the saintly Benedictine monk was originally planned to be Volume III of that study. However, because of the nature of the subject matter of the projected volume, and because of the likelihood of an even greater general interest, it was decided to present this translation as a distinct work in two volumes. The title chosen was Saints of the Missal.

As the title indicates, this work is a study of the saints commemorated in the Roman Missal on the successive days of each year. Volume I includes the saints whose feast days come within the first half of the year, Volume II will deal with those of the months of July to December.

In his miniature portraits of the saints of the missal, Abbot Baur presents the salient events of their lives. He then emphasizes those virtues which each saint practised most heroically, as these virtues are given prominence in the lessons of the breviary and in the prayers of the Mass in honour of the saint. The author concludes each sketch with a gentle spiritual nudge to the reader, to inspire him to adapt the spirituality of the saint of the day to the requirements of his own interior life.
