Post Doctoral Fellowships 1988/89

Application Deadline • September 15, 1987

The Institute invites applications from scholars engaged in advanced research in Judaic and Near Eastern Studies, the latter including pre-Christian, Christian, and Islamic history and culture, from ancient to modern times.

Any topic within these fields may be proposed. For academic year 88/89, the main topic of investigation will be the **preparation, acceptance, and interpretation of Translations of Scriptures within the three religious traditions**. Preference will be given to projects relevant to this topic, although others may be considered.

Stipends offered for the academic year will range from \$28,000 to \$50,000. Extension for a second year may be offered if a fellow's undertaking is perceived to be of exceptional value. A contribution may also be made towards travel expenses.

Awards will be announced December 15, 1987.
