At the same time it honours his work. It covers a wide variety of subjects of private and public international law, thus reflecting the wide scope of Willem Riphagen's interests and professional activities, both as the Legal Adviser to the Minister of Foreign Affairs and as a Professor of International Law.

The contributions from his friends and former colleagues deal with subjects such as State Immunity, Law of the Sea, Dispute Settlement, Human Rights and Customary International Law.
