All editorial communications should be addressed to the Secretary, Royal Asiatic Society, 56 Queen Anne Street, London W1M 9LA, in the first instance.

Contributions submitted for publication in the Society's *Journal* should be typed in double spacing on quarto paper, leaving a margin of at least 16 strokes at the left-hand side. Sheets should be numbered consecutively at the top right-hand corner. Notes, numbered consecutively through the article, should be typed on a separate sheet or sheets at the end and not at the foot of each sheet.

Authors are urged to study the conventions employed in recent issues of the *Journal*, particularly the style of citation of books and periodical articles, and the bibliographical information inserted at the head of reviews. Contributions should be submitted in a form ready for the printer; later corrections which would involve over-running can be accepted only at the Editor's discretion. Galleys will be sent to authors, but not page proofs.

Authors of articles will be supplied with 25 free copies of offprints. Additional copies can be obtained on request at moderate charges; authors are asked to notify the Editor of their requirements when returning proofs.

The Cambridge History of Iran is planned as an eight-volume survey of Iranian history and culture, its contribution to the civilization of the world. All aspects of the religious, philosophical, political, economic, scientific and artistic elements in Iranian civilization are studied, with some emphasis on the geographical and ecological factors which have contributed to that civilization's special character. The aim is to provide a collection of readable essays rather than a catalogue of information. The volumes offer scope for the publication of new ideas as well as providing summaries of established facts. It is hoped that the volumes will act as a stimulus to specialists; but they are primarily concerned to answer the sort of questions about Iran that are asked by the non-specialist.

Volume 4 is a survey of every aspect of the civilizations which flourished in the Iranian region from the Arab conquests to the Saljuq expansion: in particular, it studies the gradual transition of Iran from Zoroastrianism to Islam, the uniting of all Iranians under one rule, the flowering into full magnificence of the Persian language, and the establishment of those other arts which were to flourish so brilliantly after the Mongol conquest. The volume as a whole provides a comprehensive record of the formative centuries of Islam in Iran.
