WELLCOME INSTITUTE FOR THE HISTORY OF MEDICINE

The Wellcome Institute is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr Lindsay Granshaw as Historian of Twentieth-Century Medicine in the Academic Unit. Dr Granshaw holds the BA in history from Oxford University, and the PhD in history of science and medicine from Bryn Mawr College, Pennsylvania, USA. She is presently completing two books, one on St Thomas's Hospital, 1860–1900, and the other a history of St Mark's Hospital from its foundation in 1835. She will develop courses on medicine during the past century for the Unit's teaching programme, which is based at University College London and where Dr Granshaw holds an honorary lectureship.

The Program Committee will consider proposals for entire sessions (three papers), but will judge and accept each abstract on its own merits. This year's programme will once again include lunchtime roundtable workshops. The committee invites those interested in leading such workshops to submit a proposal outlining the session. Papers may deal with any aspect of medical history, but should not represent work that has been published or is in press.
