#### THEATRE RESEARCH / RECHERCHES THEATRALES

The International Federation published the journal Theatre Research/Recherches Théâtrales from 1959 to 1975 when it was succeeded by Theatre Research International. During these years many important articles of original research were published covering the whole field of theatre history from the earliest times, and particularly Shakespeare and the Elizabethan period, to more recent figures such as Strindberg, Craig and Beckett.
