

#### MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

Manuscripts for consideration should be e-mailed as a MS Word or rich text file to the *AJS Review* managing editor at ajsreview@ajs.cjh.org. Authors should avoid any identifying references in their submissions and provide a **separate title page** with their name, contact information, and institutional affiliation along with a **short abstract** (ca. 200 words). Manuscripts should conform to *Chicago Manual of Style*, ed. 15. Authors of accepted articles will be asked to prepare a final version in the journal's style, which is available online at: www.ajsnet.org/ajsreview.htm

#### COPYRIGHT

Submission of an article is taken to imply that it has not been previously published and is not being considered for publication elsewhere. Authors must obtain written permission for material for which they do not own the copyright. A Copyright Transfer Agreement, with certain specified rights reserved by the author, must be signed and returned to the Editors by senior authors of accepted manuscripts, prior to publication.
