

### CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

John Beeler is Associate Professor of History at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. He revised and edited C. W. C. Oman's *The Art of War in the Middle Ages*, A.D. 378-1515 and has recently contributed to the *Military Review*.

Richard L. Bushman, recently Assistant Professor of History at Brigham Young University, is an Interdisciplinary Fellow at Brown University. His book "From Puritan to Yankee: Character and the Social Order in Connecticut, 1690-1765" is soon to be published.

Nicholas R. Clifford, Instructor in History at Princeton University, is completing a book on British policy in the Far East, 1937-1941.

Arthur B. Ferguson, Professor of History at Duke University, is the author of *The Indian Summer of English Chivalry* and of articles on the English Renaissance. He contributed to early volumes of *The Army Air Forces in World War II*.

Robert D. Foulke, Fulbright Scholar at the University of London, 1959-60, and Assistant Professor of English at Trinity College, Hartford, is preparing a book on Conrad's voyage fiction.

Stephen R. Graubard is Research Associate in the Center of International Affairs, Harvard University, and Editor of Daedalus. He is the author of British Labour and the Russian Revolution and of Burke, Disraeli, and Churchill: the Politics of Perseverance.

Arthur R. M. Lower, Professor Emeritus of History at Queen's University, Kingston, is the author of *This Most Famous Stream: the Liberal Democratic Way of Life*, of *Colony to Nation: a History of Canada*, and of several other books on Canadian history. As holder of a "Senior Fellowship" from the Canada Council, he made "a voyage of discovery" into many parts of the Commonwealth in 1959-60.

Standish Meacham, Jr., Instructor in History at Harvard University, is the author of a book now in press, Henry Thornton of Clapham.
