
## NEW INSTRUMENT.

MESSRS. MAYER AND MELTZER are now prepared to supply an Aural Masseur. It is worked on the double-cylinder principle, which ensures that the apparatus runs on smoothly and gives suction strokes of equal length. The length of these strokes can be regulated by an adjustable piston, and the effect on the ear-drum can be watched by means of the small Siegle's speculum which is attached to the apparatus. The



masseur can be worked either by a compressed-air apparatus, by the hand, or by a small battery. One welcomes its appearance here, as we shall now be able to more easily ascertain for ourselves the value of this form of treatment.
