



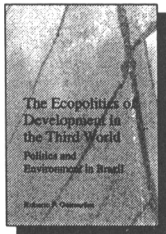

Upon acceptance, you will be asked to provide all tables and charts accompanying the manuscript on computer disks (either IBM-compatible or Macintosh) in addition to two complete, double-spaced printouts of disk material. Tables, charts, maps or other graphic materials will not be used unless provided on computer disks and in a file that is separate from that of the text. If not created by the author, permission to use such graphic materials must be provided in writing. Columns in tables and charts should use tabs instead of individual spacing. A brief biographical sketch of the author should accompany the final manuscript.

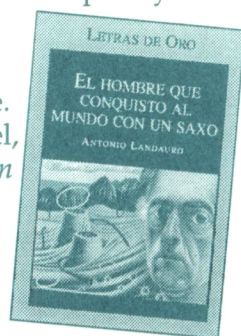

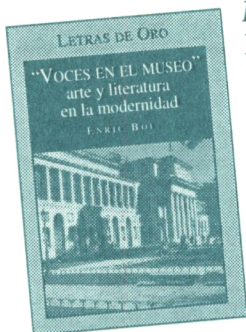
# Ten years of the best Spanish literature written in the United States
