Purpose of Publication

The incoming Journal of Chinese Dietary Culture is a new academic journal to be published semiyearly, in June and December, starting in 2004. This international journal, published by the Foundation of Chinese Dietary Culture, aims to promote the social science and humanity studies related to Chinese dietary culture concerning the social or cultural meanings of its forms, techniques, ceremonious practices, and writing genres. By which the Journal of Chinese Dietary Culture hopes to provide a new aspect of understanding to the regional and integral nature of Chinese culture, and to its social and historical processes of becoming. It is also hoped to highlight the significant contributions that dietary culture in China has to make to the world dietary culture as a whole.

Manuscripts

The Journal of Chinese Dietary Culture will publish original essays, in English or Chinese, on social science and humanity studies related to Chinese dietary culture. Manuscripts must not exceed 20,000 words for Chinese manuscripts and 10,000 words for English manuscripts or less than 30 pages for double-line texts for both. Please specify author's full name, affiliated institution, position and contact information (including phone, fax, e-mail address) on the manuscript. It is also acceptable to send out manuscripts via e-mail (preferred in Ms-Word or WordPerfect), or a 3.5" diskette through the mail; however a copy of the original manuscript with the attachment of Chinese and English abstract (no more than 300 words) and a list of key words (2 - 5 words) are also required. The author has the sole responsibility for obtaining permission to use copyrighted materials, such as illustrations, charts or lengthy quotations.

Please refer to the Journal of Foundation of Chinese Dietary Culture (will be posted on the FCDC website) for the format of an academic thesis. For the format of Chinese manuscripts please refer to the Bulletin of the Institute of History and Philology, and refer to the Journal of Asian Studies for the format of English manuscripts.

All manuscripts are subjected to an evaluating process before publishing. Upon publication, authors will receive five copies of the issue and 30 off prints of their articles and a contribution fee as well.

Theme-articles

For the purpose of promoting and consolidating research and discussion on important topics on dietary culture, each issue of the Journal of Chinese Dietary Culture, besides publishing general articles, will have several theme-articles focusing on a major theme. Research themes for issues of the first year are as follows: (1) Food in archaeology; (2) Ancient and modern food techniques; (3) Classification of food: a cross-cultural comparison; (4) Edible and non-edible, pure and impure food: construction of a cultural taxonomy.

The themes planned for the first three years also include the following: (1) The writing of cooking: recipes, formulas and sayings; (2) Gastronomic poetry: a literary genre; (3) Social distinction in dietary culture: Theories of taste; (4) The idea of healthy food in urban cultures; (5) Artificial and natural food from a historical perspective; (6) Food deficiency: ancient and modern survival strategies against starvation; (7) Commensality and etiquette: rituals and practices; (8) Inventing dietary traditions in modern times; (9) Food and sex: who cooks? Whose food? (10) We are what we eat: factual or fictive body imagery in dietary culture; (11) Dietary profession: history and development of food production; (12) Exotic, foreign and domestic food.

We prefer to accept manuscripts that are related to the above subjects, yet, it is not wholly restricted.
