

In the interests of authors, copyright is normally assigned to the Cambridge University Press. Articles in English should conform with the Journal's transliteration system. Articles will be accepted and published in French and German, with the authors expected to follow the transliteration systems normally used in those languages. Care will be taken with manuscripts submitted, but the Editor cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage which may take place. Contributors should keep at least one copy for use in correcting proofs. Contributors of articles and review articles receive 50 offprints. Extra copies may be purchased according to an agreed scale of charges.
