After Elizabeth's death in their Florentine apartment on 29 June 1861, Robert Browning commissioned the above painting, Salon at Casa Guidi, by his friend George Mignaty. Since the painting (now in the Goewey Collection of Mills College Library) provides a remarkably detailed record of the room's appearance in 1861, it is one of the chief sources of evidence being used by the Browning Institute, which owns Casa Guidi, in plans for restoration.
