Whittingham Hospital, Preston, Parkside Hospital, Macclesfield, and Booth Hall Hospital, Manchester. He got his Manchester DPM in 1955.

From 1957 until 1962 Bernard was an Assistant Child Psychiatrist in the Cambridge area. In 1962 he was asked by the then Regional Health Board to take on the monumental task of developing Child Psychiatry in Peterborough, where he was offered minimal facilities. Bernard

not only developed the children's services, but was also the driving force behind the development of what is now a small, but thriving DGH and community-based service for adults.

He was very active in the College, of which he was a Founder Member. He served on the Child Psychiatric Section for several years and did two terms of office as the representative Member on the Council for the East Anglian Division of the College.
