

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF MANUSCRIPTS

#### TITLE

The title of the paper should be kept as short

as possible.

The name of the author at the beginning of the paper should be followed only by senior qualifications.

Manuscripts must be typed (double-spaced) on one side of the paper, leaving ample margins, with the folios numbered. Words to be printed in italic should be underlined. The first mention of Latin names of species should be followed by the authority, except where reference is made to a work in which the authority appears (e.g. Plymouth Marine Fauna).

Manuscripts should be as concise as possible. Undue length will undoubtedly lead to delay in publication as the paper will be returned to the author for shortening.

All linear measurements and weights

should be in the metric scale.

For symbols and abbreviations, the recommendations of the Royal Society (1951) are followed.

#### TABLES

Tables should be set out on separate sheets numbered in Arabic numerals, and given a concise heading.

#### TEXT-FIGURES

Text-figures should be in black ink. It is important to make the lines sufficiently black. Areas to be mechanically stippled should be indicated by light blue pencil shading.

No drawing should be so large that it must be reduced to less than one-third of its original size. The degree of reduction need

not be inserted by the author.

The size of the printed area of the *Journal* page is 18 × 12 cm. The maximum size for a full-page figure (with legend) is 19½×

13½ cm.

Lettering, numerals, etc., should be inserted clearly in pencil in the appropriate place. This should be kept to a workable minimum, all details being included in the

Axes and graduation marks on graphs must be inked in. The lines on graph paper are not normally reproduced, and should be blue or faint grev.

Legends for figures must be typed all together on a separate sheet, and not inserted on the actual illustrations.

Text-figures are numbered in arabic numerals, and referred to in the text as 'Fig. 1', etc. Where there is a plate containing several figures, the text-figures are referred to as 'Text-fig. 1', etc.

All line-drawings are printed as textfigures, as well as photographs for which

fine detail is not required.

#### PLATES

Photographs should be on smooth-surfaced paper, semi-matt or glossy. The edges of the photograph must be trimmed square. It is important that the background in the photograph be of a uniform tone and free from blemishes. Where several photographs make up a single plate, they are numbered 'Fig. 1', etc.

#### SUMMARY

Each paper must be accompanied by a Summary.

#### REFERENCES

References are listed alphabetically at the end of the paper. The full title of the paper must be given. Titles of papers, but not of books, are decapitalized. Titles of Journals are abbreviated as in the World List of Scientific Publications (3rd ed., 1952. Volume (Vol.), Band (Bd.), or Tome (T.). numbers are in Arabic numerals. Where a volume appears in parts the part need only be specified where each has separate pagination. References to books should include the publisher. Citations in text to be given by author's name followed by date in brackets.

Authors are requested to see that their manuscripts are in finished form and completely ready for publication so that corrections may be reduced to a minimum, and these are confined as far as possible to the first proof. If the cost for corrections exceeds a reasonable figure, the author is liable to be charged to the full extent of the excess.
