The Giorgio Levi Della Vida Medal of the Near Eastern Center, University of California, Los Angeles, is to be awarded biennially to give recognition to an outstanding scholar whose work has significantly and lastingly advanced the study of Islamic civilization. The field is understood to include antecedents and interaction with historically connected centers of civilization. The award carries with it a bronze medal and a prize of money together with the obligation to present in person a formal lecture at the University of California, Los Angeles, as part of a conference the topic of which the recipient selects. The proceedings of the conference are to be published as a separate volume in a special series, of which this volume is the first.
