International Claims: Postwar British Practice

Richard B. Lillich

The sixth volume in the *Procedural Aspects of International Law Series*, this book describes and analyzes postwar British practice in the settlement of international claims. The author discusses in detail the Foreign Compensation Commission (FCC), the British municipal body responsible for the distribution to British claimants of lump sum settlements received from nations as compensation.

The author reviews the history of the FCC, describes its composition and operation, and then examines in detail decisions of the Commission on eligibility of claimants. Four chapters are devoted to the substantive decisions of the FCC—nationalization claims, creditor claims, war claims, and damages. The author concludes with an evaluation of the effectiveness of the FCC.

Appendixes include the Foreign Compensation Act of 1950, with amendments, and the Foreign Compensation Commission Rules of 1956, with 1964 amendments.
