P-66 - THE PROLONGED SYNDROME OF OPIUM WITHDRAWAL

The symptoms of opium withdrawal usually disappear during 2 weeks. In some patients, after withdrawal, some symptoms of depression such as fatigue, lack of interest, loss of weight, anxiety and loss of energy are observed in which with diagnosis of depression and anxiety medicines the problems remove, and after one period of treatment the patient become healthy.

Rarely the symptoms like yawning, runny nose, and sneezing last, but sometimes they last for a few months.
