Beyond access to ASN's flagship journal *Nationalities Papers*, your membership dues:


- Contribute to programs that recognize and promote exceptional works of scholarship, including work by doctoral students.

# 4th Nationalities Papers Photo Contest



Our annual photo contest rewards scholars for the best photos from their fieldwork. These photos are judged in terms of their content, synthesis, and visually compelling insights about nationalism, ethnicity, or migration. The photo submissions should be accompanied by a brief description (300-500 words) of how the photo relates to the fieldwork of the applicant in particular and nationalism, ethnicity or migration in general. This is the third year of the photo contest!

The contest is judged by a jury comprised of scholars from the editorial board of the journal and past awardees. The membership of the jury changes every year, and is led by the editor-in-chief and supported by the managing editor. The 6 prize-winning photographs will be featured on the cover of *Nationalities Papers*. The photographer will be acknowledged in *Nationalities Papers*.
