## CORRECTION

To the Editor of Philosophy of Science:

In my article "Belief and Propositions", in this journal (April 1957), I stated on page 132 that the conjunction of Carnap's L-equivalence criterion of propositional identity with his dispositional analysis of belief sentences (in *Meaning and Necessity*) entails a contradiction. But the brief reason I gave in support of this claim is unclear. The subsentence that begins with "since" on line 22 should be replaced by the following:

since he may respond affirmatively to some sentence synonymous in L with "p" yet also respond affirmatively to some sentence synonymous in L with the contradictory of "q" though "p" and "q" are L-equivalent in L; hence it would follow that he believes both p and not-q, and therefore both p and not-p, which by A<sub>3</sub> entails a contradiction.

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
