The Indigenous Cattle of the British Dependent Territories in Africa

In 1951 a survey of cattle in British Africa was conducted with the object of solving some of the problems connected with development and breeding in the tropics. A report on the survey was published under the title *The Improvement of Cattle in British Colonial Territories in Africa* (HMSO, 10s. 6d., post 7d.). The present complementary work describes the distinctive types and breeds of indigenous cattle found in the territories surveyed, together with Southern Rhodesia, the High Commission Territories, Libya, and Sudan. In addition to text-figures and maps there are 60 pages of photographs and a full bibliography.
