It is suggested that the last mentioned gathering would take place in November and that, in order to do the trip comfortably, three months would be required.

The Summer Meeting of the Conjoint Sections of Otology and Laryngology of the Royal Society of Medicine will be held this year in conjunction with the Scotch Oto-rhino-laryngological Society in Edinburgh on Friday and Saturday, the 2nd and 3rd June.

The first number reaches us of a new Journal, Archivio Italiano per le Malattie della Trachea-Bronchi-Esofago, devoted to the Endoscopy of the œsophagus and air passages. It is edited by Professor F. Lasagna, of Parma, who is personally well known to many in this country.

This first sample of the *Archivio* has an excellent make-up. Paper, type and illustrations are admirable in quality. As it is part of the editor's scheme to print articles in different languages the first communication by Professor Seiffert is in German. The second one, in Italian, gives Professor Lasagna's experiments on the reconstruction of the œsophageal tube after complete excision of a portion of it. These are followed by a selection of abstracts.

The Archivio will be published every three months. The subscription is forty-five lire (about ten shillings) and should be sent to the Administration, The Throat and Ear Clinic, Parma, Italy.


SCOTTISH SOCIETY OF OTOLOGY AND LARYNGOLOGY.



The head rest enables the operator himself to place the patient in the desired position for a variety of operations. All parts touched by the operator are sterilisable.

The apparatus is an elaboration of Haslinger's Bronchoscopic head rest, but its range of utility is extended to enable the patient to be supported with the shoulders beyond the end of the table for æsophagoscopy, and to be kept in the correct attitude during operations performed in the sitting or semi-sitting position.
