CONTRIBUTORS

Mallory Matsumoto is Assistant Professor in the Department of Religious Studies at the University of Texas at Austin. Her research addresses the interface between language, material culture, and religion in the Maya region of Mesoamerica during the precolonial and early colonial periods. She received her PhD in anthropology from Brown University in 2021.

James V. Torres is Assistant Professor at Universidad de los Andes (Bogotá, Colombia). He is author of the book Minería y moneda en el Nuevo Reino de Granada. El desempeño económico en la segunda mitad del siglo XVIII (2013) and coauthor of La Compañía Barrio y Sordo. Negocios y política en el Nuevo Reino de Granada y Venezuela (2022). He has also published several articles in refereed journals, such as "Connecting the Northern Andes and the Atlantic: The Role of Inland Ports in New Granada's Interregional Trade (1770–1809)" (Journal of Iberian and Latin American Economic History, 2020) and "Entre el oro y la plata. Quito, el suroccidente de la Nueva Granada y el movimiento de mercancías norandino a fines del siglo XVIII" (Colonial Latin American Review, 2018). He is presently turning his dissertation "Trade in a Changing World: Gold, Silver, and Commodity Flows in the Northern Andes, 1780–1840" (Georgetown University, 2021) into a book.

Taylor Cozzens, a PhD candidate in the History Department of the University of Oklahoma, has published articles in the journals *Agricultural History* and *California Legal History*. His research interests include modern Latin America, the American West, agriculture, and intermediaries. His dissertation examines the Green Revolution in the Andes.

Casey Marina Lurtz is Assistant Professor of History at Johns Hopkins University and co-chair of the Latin American, Caribbean, & Latinx Studies program. She researches questions of rural development, world markets, the environment, and economic ideas in the long nineteenth century. Lurtz is the author of From the Grounds Up: Building an Export Economy in Southern Mexico (Stanford University Press, 2019), recently released in Spanish as Desde las raíces. Actores locales y la creación de una economía de exportación en el sur de México (UNAM-CIMSUR, 2022).

Barbara Tenenbaum, librarian and scholar, was the first Mexican Specialist in the US Library of Congress Hispanic Division, a position from which she retired in 2015. She has also had a distinguished career in teaching and scholarly publications in Latin American Studies, both broadly and in connection with nineteenth-century Mexican history and politics. A longer biographical note appears in this issue, following her interview with her long-time Library colleague Georgette Dorn, who herself retired from the Hispanic Division in 2018.
