Papers should indicate the wider significance of detailed original research findings as well as the logic and limitations of specialized techniques of analysis. Comments and shorter notes are also welcome. The Journal does not accept unsolicited book reviews, nor can it honor requests to review particular works. Contributions should be kept within 35 double-spaced pages, inclusive of footnotes, references, figures, and tables. Three copies of each manuscript should be submitted. A submission fee of \$20.00 or a year's membership (fee schedule below) is required from nonmembers of the Association.
