Call for Papers: Hegel's Philosophy of Right

For the Fifteenth Biennial Meeting of the Hegel Society of America Hosted by the University of Georgia, Athens, GA Friday through Sunday October 2-4, 1998

Deadline for submission of papers: January 23, 1998

The conference topic covers all aspects of the Philosophy of Right. The Society welcomes a variety of papers that deal with the recently available earlier lectures on Rechtsphilosophie that clarify themes, or reveal developments and changes in Hegel's thought, papers on the logic of the Philosophy of Right, papers that deal with Hegel's thought in relation to other philosophers (eg Rousseau, Kant, Fichte, Marx, Nietzsche, Rawls, Habermas), or in relation to contemporary issues and problems (eg family, gender issues, poverty, war, Holocaust).

In order to guarantee a fair distribution of conference time, submitted papers are limited to 6000 words (ie about 23 double spaced pages at 260 words per page). Papers must be submitted at this length and later adjustments must remain within this limit. The format should be appropriate for blind reviewing. An abstract of 100 words, accompanied by a short list of principal texts used, must be submitted with the paper. Please send four copies of these materials to:
