Manuscripts

The China Quarterly welcomes the submission of manuscripts from scholars, including postgraduate students, on all aspects of contemporary China and from all points of view, including those which deal with Taiwan and overseas Chinese. Articles on China prior to 1949 are also welcome, particularly, but not exclusively, when these relate directly to contemporary China or to the history of the Chinese Communist Party. Articles should be submitted in quadruplicate to the editorial office. They should normally not exceed 8,000 words in length; should be typed in double spacing with footnotes at the end; and should conform to the styling of *The China Quarterly* (see below). Submission of a manuscript is taken to imply that it has not previously been published in any form (including non-copyrighted working papers) and that it is not currently being considered elsewhere.

The China Quarterly is published by the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London. The views expressed in articles are those of individual authors and do not necessarily represent the views of the School.

Style

Romanization

Pinyin is used without tone/diacritical marks, except the following which should use the Wade-Giles system: names such as Chiang Kai-shek, Sun Yat-sen, Taipei and Kuomintang; names of individuals living outside mainland China. Chinese characters should be provided on the first occurrence of each romanization, to assist in proofreading.

Subsequent citations

Use *ibid.* to refer only to the immediately preceding reference or part of it; *idem.* and *op. cit.* should not be used. The shortened title system is used as follows:

(English) Surname, *Shortened Title*, pp. ?.

Articles:

(Chinese) Full name of author, "Shortened title of article in English," pp. ?.

(English) Surname, "Shortened title of article," pp. ?.
