

193 So that the delivery of health care to Aboriginals can be maximised, the Committee recommends that

Aboriginal cultural beliefs and practices which affect their health and their use of health services such as their fear of hospitalisation, their attitudes to pain and surgery, the role of traditional healers and the differing needs and roles of Aboriginal men and women be fully taken into account in the design and implementation of health care programs.
